GOLD DIGGERS

YANKS SHOCKED AND AWED

Three soldiers, a Navy clearance diver and an RAAF physical training instructor demonstrated tremendous courage, determination and prowess at the US Marine Corps Paralympic Trials in February.

The five, who are part of the Australian Defence Force Paralympic Sports Program, shocked their military counterparts from the United States, Canada and Britain when they took away 12 gold medals, 11 silver and 1 bronze.

In fact, at one point, their opponents were said to have been quite fearful that the Aussies would take out all the gold available for swimming – and they came very close, hauling 10 gold from the pool.

The ADF Paralympic Sports Team was participating in Exercise Wounded Warrior, conducted in the US and Canada from February 6-28, which also included an exchange with the Canadian Forces' Soldier On Program, giving the Aussies an opportunity to learn adaptive snow sports at Mt Washington, Canada.

Private Clint Vardy, a clerk with Army Personnel Agency, Brisbane, topped the

Aussie medal haul with medals in three different sports, including swimming where he bagged four gold medals, as well as one gold and three silver medals on the running track and another gold for shooting.

Able Seaman Paul De Geler, a clearance diver with the Royal Australian Navy Dive School at HMAS Penguin, also took four gold medals in the pool as well as two silver medals for shooting – piped for gold by Private Vardy in the 30m air rifle.

Flight Sergeant Tony Benfer, a physical

training instructor at RAAF Base Wagga Wagga, won three gold in swimming, as well as a silver medal in wheelchair basketball.

Warrant Officer Class Two Dennis Ramsey, an instructor at the Army Logistics Training Centre, Wodonga, Victoria, won four silver medals in track and field as well as bronze in shot-put and wheelchair basketball.

Private Damien Thomlinson, a commando with 2 Commando Regiment, won one gold and one silver medal in the pool.

In all, the team of five Aussie servicemen

brought home 24 medals.

Private Vardy, who lost an arm in a motorbike accident, said he was particularly pleased with his gold medal in the 30m air-rifle event because he just pipped former infantryman turned clearance diver Paul De Geler.

Minister for Defence Science and Personnel, Warren Snowdon, met and congratulated the team shortly after their triumphant return from America.

"[This ADF team] competed against approximately 150 other wounded and severely injured members from the British Royal Marines, the Dutch Royal Marines and the US Marine Corps and have performed at the highest level," Mr Snowdon said.

"For five individuals to come back with 24 medals between them is a tremendous feat.

"I congratulate each of these members on not only overcoming the significant hurdles they have faced individually after significant injury, but also on their successes in the sporting arena.

"You have represented your country to the highest standard and we are all very proud of you."

Defence Chief and Patron of the ADF Paralympic Sports Association Air Chief Marshal Angus Houston also congratulated the ADF members on their participation and success.

"This is an outstanding result. Your dedication and determination are an inspiration to us all," Air Chief Marshal Houston said.

"I look forward to continuing to follow our members' progress as they compete at home and abroad and continue to make us proud."
